THE LARAMIE PROJECT: Tuesday, May 13, 2nd Pd Assembly AND Evening Performance!

The 1998 murder of Matthew Shepard, a 21-year-old gay student at the University of Wyoming, focused national attention on hate crimes, bigotry and homophobia. One month after Shepard's killing, playwright Moises Kaufman and members of his theater company decided to travel to Laramie to document the town's reactions to Shepard's death. After conducting more than 200 interviews, the writers assembled a unique play created from verbatim excerpts of conversations with the residents of Laramie. In an era of increasing divisiveness, this play can inspire students to reflect on a myriad of vital and timely issues, including the nature of tolerance, acceptance and pluralism; the meaning of community; and the struggle to overcome hate, bigotry and violence.
